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Dear KVC Friends,

While KVC has become a national leader in child and family wellbeing, the heart of our work remains simple and local: **it's about helping people**. We began as a group of families and friends moved to help specific children who were in need. As we've grown, **we've continued to be anchored by resilient roots – people like you who care about their neighbors and connect with like-minded friends** to make sure every child is safe, supported and loved.

This year, the KVC family has grown again. We welcomed 800 employees from St. Louis, MO-based Great Circle into our organization, and we're honored to carry Great Circle's mission forward. We also announced a joint venture with Children's Mercy Kansas City to open a new 72-bed, world-class, inpatient mental health hospital in Olathe, KS. Meanwhile, we've continued deepening our partnerships and reach in Kentucky, West Virginia, and Nebraska.

With this 2023 Impact Report, we want to thank you for your support and show you the incredible difference you're making through KVC.

**During fiscal year 2023, we:**

- Strengthened over 13,000 families, helping parents create safe, loving homes.
- Prevented child abuse and neglect by stabilizing families in crisis and supporting families to care for nearly 5,000 children in foster care.
- Helped people achieve mental wellness through our 4,688 youth admissions to our acute children's mental health hospitals and residential programs and over 35,000 people served with other mental health services.

**In total, KVC Health Systems' local teams made a positive difference in over 74,000 people's lives this past year.**

When reunification isn't an option, we connect children with loving forever families through adoption.

# We prevent child abuse and neglect.

Foster care provides a safe, nurturing environment that gives a child's birth family an opportunity to resolve conflicts and learn healthy skills so the child can safely return home. **KVC recruits, trains and supports compassionate adults to serve as foster parents.** These individuals ensure that children receive the nurturing, support and education they need to thrive, and play an important role in helping children recover from trauma and/or neglect.

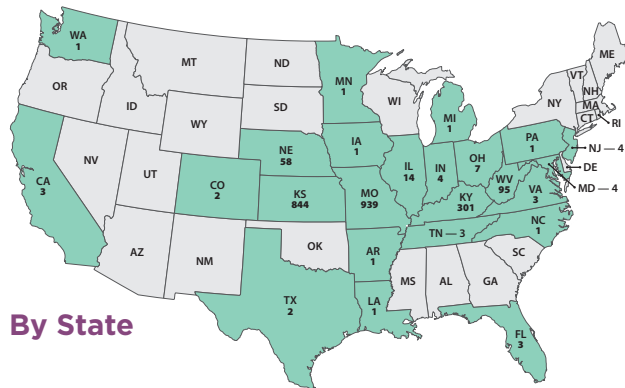
Some of our continuing efforts to deepen DEI+B across our organization include:

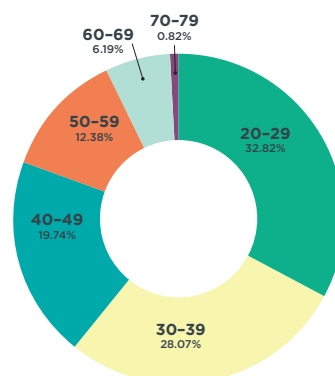


By State

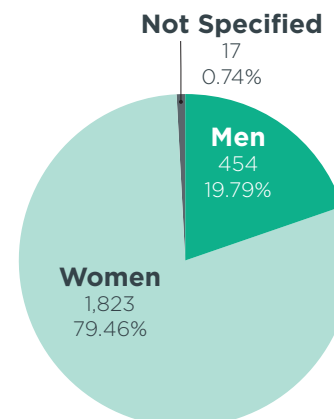

*By The Numbers*

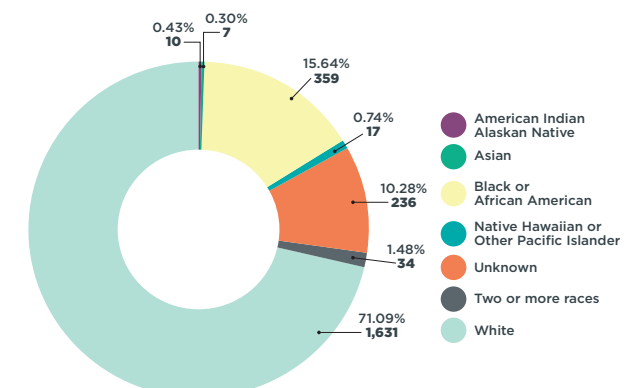
By Age Range



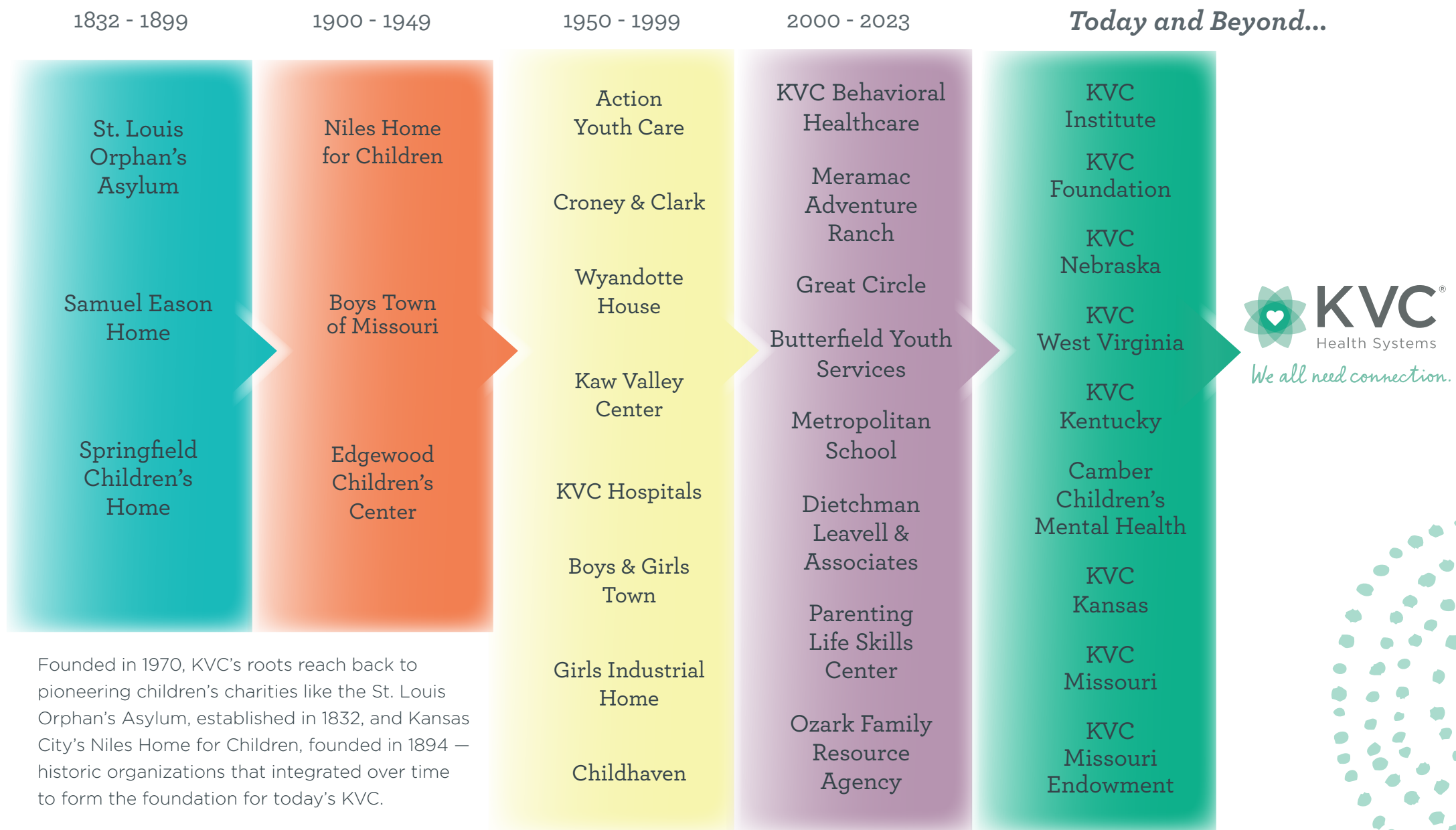
By Gender

# FY23 Impact at a Glance

## National Impact

**74,338** people served and positively impacted by KVC

# KVC Foundation

*Dear Friends of the KVC Foundation,*

In March, the movie *Everything Everywhere All at Once* won Best Picture at the Oscars. It's a fantastical movie that shows mental health challenges through a unique, multiverse lens. In addition to raising awareness and decreasing stigma around mental health topics, the title lends itself rather well to KVC's activity this spring.

***With perseverance and outstanding public and private support, Camber (formerly KVC Hospitals) opened a new children's mental health hospital and residential treatment center in Hays, Kansas.*** With data from the Center for Healthcare Quality and Payment Reform showing half of the rural hospitals in Kansas at risk of closing, KVC and Camber doubled-down on their commitment to rural mental healthcare. Camber opened the doors in February.

***In April, KVC took a significant step forward with the addition of Great Circle to the KVC Missouri family,*** bringing together our collective strengths, expertise, and resources to amplify our impact and reach across Missouri. We're eager to scale strengths in Autism and Education Services, while we plan how to increase acute psychiatric inpatient care for Missouri youth.

***In June, KVC Health Systems broke ground on a new joint venture hospital with our partner, Children's Mercy Hospital.*** Together, we've secured lead gifts from the generous Sunderland Foundation and the SPARK Committee of the State of Kansas. We're eager to secure the remaining funds to complete our \$53 million campaign to open this new 72 bed (48 youth, 24 adult) mental wellness campus in Olathe, KS in fall of 2024.

None of these achievements would have been possible without the unwavering support of our donors. Together, we raised more than \$10 million dollars in gifts (excluding Olathe project) and pledges from over 42 states and 2 countries. This remarkable show of support is a testament to the incredible communities we call home. Every dollar, holiday meal, backpack full of school supplies, and warm blanket donated is a symbol of hope, a lifeline for families, and a catalyst for transformation.

***Our journey is far from over, and together, we can shape a future where every person is safe and connected to a strong family and a healthy community.*** We are honored to have you as part of the KVC family, and we look forward to what this new year brings!

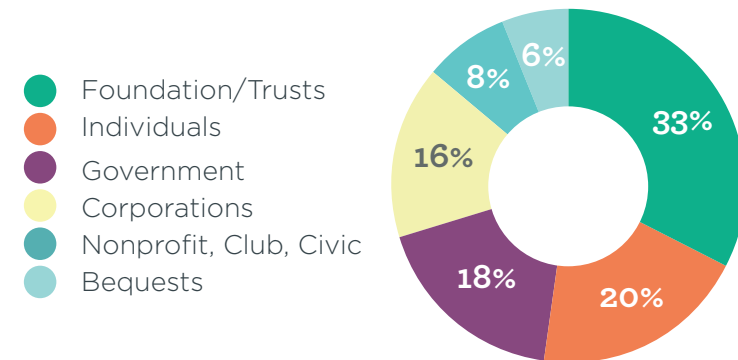

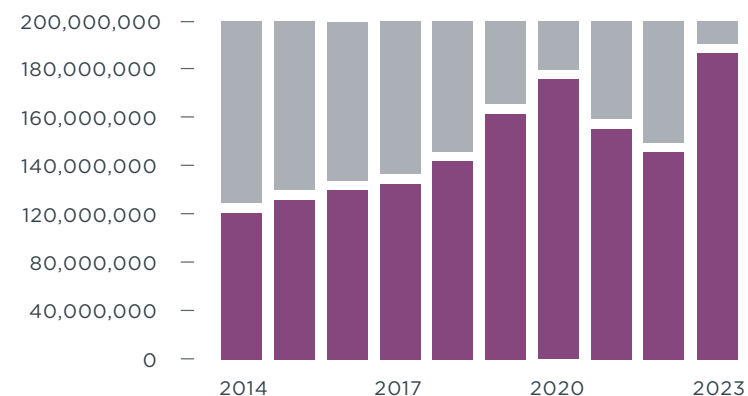

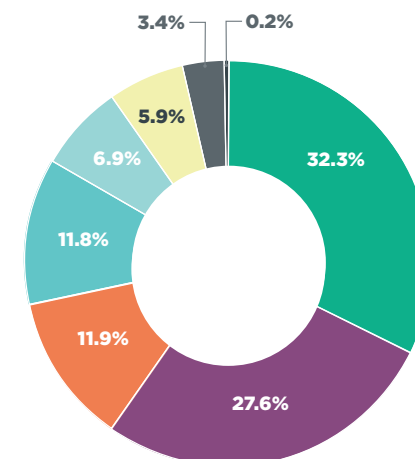
